Check the syllabus for each of your courses.	A week before school starts check your courses' syllabi, calendar important exam dates, and project deadlines, and list the books and supplies needed for each course. The syllabus for each course will be located in an online tool called <u>Canvas</u> .	
Purchase books and supplies.	A week before school starts, check your course syllabus on Canvas and purchase your necessary books and supplies. You may buy your books and supplies online.
