- Customizable Quarterly Family Newsletters. These templates provide college and career readiness information for 7th—12th-grade students and are available in Arabic, Chinese, English, Korean, Marshallese, Punjabi, Russian, Somali, Spanish, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese.
- Match Tip: Did you know that community volunteers or guest speakers can be a match? Are you counting their
 preparation and travel time? Well, if not, you CAN! That preparation time is part of their preparation for your
 event, so it is valuable match time. It must be documented separately on the Goods and Services match form, so
 list it as preparation time.

- FSA Launches Beta Version of FAFSA Ahead of Schedule. The Department of Education has begun beta testing the 2026-27 FAFSA form, which will officially open for all students on Oct. 1.
- FAFSA 2026–27: Preview Now Available. Kick off FAFSA season with our ready-to-use PowerPoint and PDF, including screenshots, step-by-step guides, and updates for the 2026–27 form. Ideal for staff training and student support, it covers dependent, independent, and provisionally independent scenarios, along with correction situations. Pro Tip: Have students create FSA IDs early to ease the process!

CTS funding can also be used at two apprenticeship sponsors, AJAC Advanced Manufacturing Apprenticeships and Evergreen Rural Water. Search the sponsor name in the eligible programs list. WSOS can cover costs beyond tuition, such as housing, transportation, food, and more.	10/16
NCWIT Award for Aspirations in Computing	For 9th - 12th-grade students, it recognizes their computing-related achievements and interests, encouraging them to pursue their passions.	10/28
U.S. Bank Scholarship Program	Complete a series of Financial Genius for Life online learning modules for a chance to win. \$2,500-\$20,000	10/30
Voice of Democracy Scholarship.	(\$35,000) The Voice of Democracy audio-essay program offers high school students a unique opportunity to express themselves through a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. The national first-place winner receives a \$35,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college, or vocational/technical school.	10/31
Zombie Apocalypse Scholarship	(\$2,000) - In 250 words or fewer, submit a response to the question: "Imagine that your high school or college has been overrun with zombies. Your math professor, the cafeteria ladies, and even your best friend have all joined the walking dead. Flesh out a plan to avoid the zombies, including where you'd hide and the top-five things you'd bring to stay alive."	10/31
