- Match Tip: Is GEAR UP helping to establish a job shadow program? Are students participating in job shadows to enhance their career exploration activities? Job shadows offer significant value, as the host site is donating time to provide this opportunity for students. Staff time can be documented on a Goods and Services match form. If GEAR UP is not covering transportation costs, you can document match contributions at the current mileage reimbursement rate on the Goods and Services form, as the donor is driving. If the driver is a volunteer or a parent, their time spent transporting the student also counts as a matching contribution.
