WA State GEAR UP Program Updates

- **Fee Waivers for GEAR UP Students.** NCCEP has partnered with the Common App and NACAC to provide GEAR UP families with fee waivers for college applications. Access the Educator [College Application Fee Waiver Resource Guide](#) and the Student [Fee Waiver Flyer](#). Additionally, students who had waivers for the SAT/ACT automatically qualify for waivers. - **Match Tip:** If your district policy charges a fee for the use of space to internal or external groups but provides the facility at no cost for GEAR UP use, then you may consider that fee an allowable source of match. For example, if your school district normally charges a group \$100 to use the cafeteria for an evening meeting, you may submit a Goods and Services match form for \$100. However, if your district has a policy stating that outside groups and/or school programs are not to be charged for space, you cannot document or submit it as a match. Please discuss this tip with your leadership to verify what is allowable.

Scholarship	Brief Description	Due
NSHSS Foundation STEM Scholarship	\$1,000 scholarships for underrepresented students with a 3.0 GPA or higher who plan to study a STEM field.	10/15
WSOS Career & Technical Scholarship (CTS) 101	This scholarship provides up to \$1,500 per quarter toward eligible associate degrees, certificates, or apprenticeships at eligible community or technical colleges. CTS funding can also be used at two apprenticeship sponsors, AJAC Advanced Manufacturing Apprenticeships and Evergreen Rural Water. Search the sponsor name in the eligible programs list . WSOS can cover costs beyond tuition, such as housing, transportation, food, and more.	10/16
NCWIT Award for Aspirations in Computing	For 9th - 12th-grade students, it recognizes their computing-related achievements and interests, encouraging them to pursue their passions.	10/28
U.S. Bank Scholarship Program	Complete a series of Financial Genius for Life online learning modules for a chance to win. \$2,500-\$20,000	10/30
Voice of Democracy Scholarship.	(\$35,000) The Voice of Democracy audio-essay program provides high school students with a unique opportunity to express themselves through a recorded essay that is both democratic and patriotic in theme.	10/31
Zombie Apocalypse Scholarship	(\$2,000) - In 250 words or fewer, submit a response to the question: "Imagine that your high school or college has been overrun with zombies. Your math professor, the cafeteria ladies, and even your best friend have all joined the walking dead. Flesh out a plan to avoid the zombies, including where you'd hide and the top-five things you'd bring to stay alive."	10/31
Elks Most Valuable Student Competition	\$1,000 to \$7,500 per year for full-time students (minimum 12 semester hours) pursuing a four-year degree at a U.S. college or university.	11/12
Jack Kent Cooke College Scholarship Program	For high-achieving high school seniors with financial need. It is aimed at those attending top four-year colleges. Each award covers a significant portion of educational expenses, including tuition and living costs, and varies based on individual circumstances and other financial aid received.	11/12
Odenza Marketing Group Scholarship	(\$500) Submit two small essays: one about travel and one on why you deserve the scholarship. Ages 16-25, must have a GPA of 2.5+ and be a US citizen.	11/15
10 Words or Less Scholarship	(\$500) - In 10 words or fewer, say why you deserve the scholarship.	11/15
Governor's Scholarship for Foster Youth	(\$2,000-\$4,000) - Helps youth from foster care continue their education and earn a college degree.	11/30

Leadership 1000 Scholarship	Provides up to \$5,000 per academic year to high school seniors from eligible WA high schools planning to enroll in a college or university. This renewable scholarship also offers career guidance, financial aid support, and networking opportunities.	11/30
Education Matters	(\$5,000) - In 250 words or fewer, respond to: "What would you say to someone who thinks education doesn't matter or that college is a waste of time and money?" This award is for students aged 14+ who are legal residents.	11/30
Dell Scholars Program.	(\$20,000) - For students who have demonstrated grit, potential, and ambition in their quest for education.	12/1
Ron Brown Scholar Program	This program awards 20 or more college scholarships annually, each in the amount of \$40,000, to extraordinary African American high school seniors. Students must attend a four-year accredited college or university.	12/1
Point Foundation: The Point Flagship Scholarship	Empowers LGBTQ+ and ally students in pursuing undergraduate, graduate, & doctoral degrees at accredited colleges by offering financial support, community resources, and professional development opportunities. Financial award based on need, renewable for up to four years of support.	12/5
Scholastic Art & Writing Awards Scholarships	Teens in grades 7–12 (ages 13 and up) can apply in 28 categories of art and writing. See link for local deadlines: http://www.artandwriting.org/the-awards/guidelines-deadlines/	12/5
Dirk Derrick Car & Truck Accident Injury Scholarship	\$1,000 – For any current or soon-to-be undergraduate student who has had their life altered due to an injury from a car or truck accident, be it their injury or that of a loved one, or an influential individual.	12/15
NASA Student Art Contest	This year's theme encourages students to recognize the relationship between art, science, and technology that exists all around them and discover new ways to connect the dots. The contest is open to K-12 students who are residents of the United States.	12/31
Mann Lake Beekeeping Scholarship	For those who are currently enrolled in or about to be enrolled in an apiology program, majoring in agriculture & environmental sciences, or other related studies. Offers a one-time award of \$1,000 to cover educational-related costs, including tuition, books, computers, room and board, and other educational expenses.	12/31
Stromberg's Scholarship Program	Provides a one-time reward of \$1000 to pay for tuition, books, computers, accommodation, or any education-related expense. No GPA requirement and no application forms.	12/31
Top Ten List Scholarship	(\$1,500) - In 250 words or fewer, submit a response to the question: "Create a Top Ten List of the top ten reasons you should get this scholarship."	12/31
Unigo \$10K Scholarship	(\$10,000) - Submit an online written response to the question: "2020 was a year to be remembered. What will you remember most about 2020 and why is it important to you?" (250 words or fewer)	12/31
