
Hope Triangle

Financial Aid Basics September 29th 10-11:00am

Participants will learn the basics of financial aid. We will cover federal and state aid programs including grants, scholarships, work study and loans. We will also discuss when and where to apply for financial aid. Participants will leave with a better understanding of postsecondary funding. This session will prepare participants to help with basic financial aid questions.



Financial Aid Navigation October 6th 10:00am-12:00pm

Participants will learn about the financial aid process and how to help others navigate applying for financial aid. We will cover how to apply for postsecondary funding with the FAFSA and the WASFA. We will also discuss common challenges and errors as well as next steps. Participants will leave with a better understanding of how to help others with this important process. This session will prepare participants to assist students as they apply for financial aid and train others.

Junior Survey Results

College Going Aspirations

- **56.7**% expect to achieve some level of college education.
 - **40.5**% BA/BS
 - ▶ 11.8% AA/AS
 - ▶ 12.4% Apprentice/Less than 2Y/Tech Program
 - ► 17.4% UNDECIDED

Support Needed

- Completing college applications
- Financial aid applications
- Deciding where to attend
- College/career visits
- Reviewing options with family
- Understanding differences in options

Other Lessons

- 56.7% don't know they can use gearup.wa.gov.
- 83% said someone has talked to them about posthigh school opportunities

Educator Survey Results

College Going Aspirations

- > 74.4% said all students are capable of going to college.
- 33% believe students will complete a postsecondary degree.
 - **23**% AA/AS
 - ▶ **9**% BA/BS or higher
- ▶ 44% believe students will attend a college but not obtain a degree.

College Going Culture Score

- 22.9/40 (57.3%) overall average
- ▶ 51% believe their school works to create a culture that all students are told they should complete some kind of PSE but only 40% believe they are personally responsible for doing so.
